



JUNE PROGRAM - TOM BOLEY **RED OAK HOLLOW LATHE WORKS**

Tom Boley has been a nobby woodworker and started woodturning in 1995. When the chance **OM BOLEY** has been a hobby woodworker all his life, arose in December 2005 to make money in woodturning,

he changed directions to focus on architectural work. Since then, he has been a full-time woodturner, making custom turned items for both restoration and new construction - single items or hundreds of the same piece.



Tom has become well known for his unique Mace-of-Office pieces made for universities and colleges. Shown here is Dr. Paul Bonicelli, Dean at Patrick Henry College, carrying the mace for the first time in May 2005 and the detail of the headpiece holding the brass engraved plate of the crest of the college. The woods used are Mahogany and Olive for three sets of decorative rings. Tom has also made maces for Antioch University, University of California's Hastings College of Law, and seventeen other prestigious institutions.

He still enjoys working on the artistic side of woodturning as a hobby and participates in two or three craft shows each year. He produces bowls, bottle stoppers, pens, sweater pins, gavels, and other items. Tom's favorite turnings are natural-edge bowls in several different forms, specializing in square natural edge bowls and what he calls log bowls.

For MCW, Tom plans to demonstrate turning a plate/tray/platter, using double-sided tape -"You gotta attach it to the lathe somehow." The plate shown at the bottom is one of a matching set of 24, turned from the same maple log.

PROGRESS REPORT → MCW DEMONSRATION DAY

Demonstration Day is set for **Saturday, October 16th** from **10:00AM** to **3:00AM**, with a one hour lunch break. Jack Enders and I along with Matt Nauman from the Woodworkers Club are refining our plans for the event and will be conducting monthly status checkpoints.

We have designed the event as a major MCW activity, but will be adjusting the scope based on actual MCW volunteer levels and other resource commitments as the planning and execution progresses.

We are in good shape for lathes, sharpening equipment and the various supporting items such as tables, brochures, handout material, display items, etc.



But our ultimate success will depend on the levels of attendance and volunteer support.

We need 5-10 turning Demonstrators, 5-10 Demonstrator Assistants, and 6-8 additional Volunteers for the various support teams.

By the time of this newsletter is delivered, we will have already begun contacting Members to volunteer as Demonstrators, Demonstrator Assistants, and several support teams to address setup/takedown, an MCW Member Display Gallery, and an MCW Information Booth.

Every MCW member is encouraged to find a way to volunteer for one or more of the areas. Consider demonstrating. If your are not able to develop a demonstration of your own, please consider being a Demonstrator Assistant to interact with the audience while the Demonstrator is turning.

Another volunteer role is to setup and staff the MCW Information Display Booth and field questions about MCW and turning in general. If you prefer behind the scenes involvement, consider helping to setup/takedown lathe stations or display gallery.

We are looking for as wide a variety as possible of turned items for the demonstrations on the various lathes. In the next column are suggestions for items which might be of interest to attendees. This is by no means a definitave list. Suggestions from other members would be extremely helpful.

INTRODUCTION TO WOODTURNING [30-MINUTE CLASSES.]

• Brief explanation and demonstration of turning, the lathe, and of how to use turning tools [roughing gouge, spindle gouge, scraper, parting tool, bowl gouge] and answering questions.

◆ FOR THE TWO MINI LATHES

• Pens, Key Chains, Tops, Scoops, Weed Pots, Tool Handles, Chessmen, Rattles, Ringholders, Bottle Stoppers.

♦ FOR ONE MIDI & ONE FULL-SIZE LATHE

- Boxes, Lidded Vessels, Miniature Bottles, Finials
- Ornaments, Spheres, Eggs, Acorns, Mushrooms, Birdhouses.
- Carving Mallets, Candle Sticks, Knitting Needles

◆ FOR THE FULL-SIZE LATHE

- Bowls, Natural Edge Bowls, Green Wood Turning, Rectangle Bowls.
- Hollow Forms, Segmented Vessels.
- Platters, Plates, Trays.
- Vessels, Spirit Vessels, Bud Vases, Thin Stemmed Goblets.
- Table Legs, Split Turnings, Offset Turnings, Multiaxis Turnings.
- Turnings for Woodworkers.

◆ SHARPENING & HONING [WOLVERINE, JET, TORMEK, WORKSHARP.]

• Sharpening Basics for Turners (Gouges, Chisels, Parting Tools)

We will incur some costs for the event – volunteer lunches, refreshments, demonstrator materials reimbursement, signs, printing handouts, safety shields, display shelf unit materials, and display booth display board. Some of these are one-time costs and the shelves and lathe safety shields should be able to be used for other MCW activities in the future.

MCW DEMONSRATION DAY → VOLUNTEERS & RESPONSIBILITIES

VOLUNTEERS	DUTIES & RESPONSIBILITIES
Demonstrators	 Develop a turning demonstration with emphasis on techniques and tools. Segment into 15-20 minute units for easy audience consumption. Procure and prepare rough turning blanks. Arrange to use personal turning tools, chucks, accessories and supplies. Work with Assistant and identify logical flow and key points for Assistant to stress with audience. Practice Demonstration at home. Practice with actual lathe at Woodworkers Club week of 10/09-10/15 and include Assistant involvement in practice. Become familiar with sharpening stations at Woodworkers Club. Conduct demonstrations.
Demonstrator Assistants	 Interact with audience. Work with Demonstrator to stress key points. Support Demonstrator.
Setup/Takedown Team	 Set up equipment on 10/15 and finalize on 10/16 before 10:00am. Take down equipment on 10/16 – after 3:00 pm
Sharpening Team	 Set up two sharpening stations and display of alternative sharpening options. Field audience questions regarding sharpening. Demonstrate sharpening techniques (gouges, scrapers, skew chisels, parting tools, specialty tools).
Display Gallery Team	 Solicit and collect MCW member turned objects by or at September meeting. Arrange small placard cards identifying object, size, material, turner. Setup Display Gallery table, shelving and turned objects. Take down Display Gallery table, shelving and turned objects. Return turned objects to members at October MCW meeting.
Information Booth Team	 Identify, arrange for, and collect items available at the information booth. [See Inventory List] Setup and takedown Information Booth, Display Board, and Survey Table. Setup items on Information Booth, Display Board, and Survey Table. Field audience questions during the day and monitor survey table. Conduct drawing for giveaway at 2:45 PM.
Signs Team	 Post and remove signs at Rockville Pike & Nicholson Lane, Boiling Brook Parkway & Wyaconda Road. Put up and remove signs, banners, ribbons on outside of Woodworker's Club. Put up and remove signs, banners, placards inside Club.
Refreshments Team	 Arrange for refreshments and volunteer lunches. Setup, monitor, and takedown refreshments table and refreshments. Coordinate Volunteer lunches.

SCULPTURE DEDICATION AT STRATHMORE MUSIC CENTER

URRAY STEIN's musical sculpture, *Schubert's Trout Quintet*, will be dedicated on Tuesday, June 15th, at 11:00 AM, in a ceremony at the Strathmore Music Center at 5301 Tuckerman Lane, North Bethesda.

Murray spends his summers at a home in Montgomery County, and lives the rest of the year in Dallas, where he is a member of the Dallas Area Woodturners. [Perhaps someone who knows Mr. Stein could invite him to join his hometown wooturner's club?]

To make the sculpture, Murray used a laminate called Parallam, made of Tulip Poplar, perfect for the skeletal elements of the instruments. The strings are thin dowels. The keyboard was made from a segmented turning, using tiger maple and gaboon ebony. He turned the keyboard as a cylindrical bottomless bowl (like Malcolm Tibbetts), cut it into quarters, then reassembled the pieces as a sine wave, so it can weave over and under the elements of the cello and the bass.

The violin and viola overlap to form the outline of a fish (use your imagination) – the Trout. This outline is emphasized with dichroic glass, so the vivid colors form a "Rainbow" Trout.



FUTURE DEMONSTRATIONS/EVENTS

GARY GUENTHER

▶ July 8th – Warren Carpenter – Working with burls and inserting slices of walnut in bowl edges.

We had such a good time with Warren last November, he is coming back and show us more of his magic with "interesting" pieces of wood. Burls are rare and often expensive, and it takes vision and practice to make the most of them. Warren will help us see what's inside. And this time, he'll show us how he puts walnut slices into some of his pieces.

→ August 12th – *To Be Determined.*

▶ September 9th – Mark Sfirri – An Acknowleged Master of Multi-Axis Turning.

Mark's unique and instantly recognizable works are in the best museums and collections in the world. We have seen some of his pieces in our field trips. It's going to be really hard to decide what forms to ask Mark to turn from his amazing repertoire of bats, candlesticks, figures, curved handles, etc. Mark was in Washington in April to receive a Distinguished Educator award from the James Renwick Alliance, and we are very pleased and privileged that he will be able to come back to join us in September.

♦ October 7th – Jim Duxberry – Techniques for making a kaleidoscope.

Jim will demonstrate the turning of centerless pieces with his unique cone jig and apply this technique to the construction of his Traditional Model Kaleidoscope. This approach is adaptable for hollow vessels such as birdhouses, ornaments, or any staved-type cylindrical pieces. Jim is also the inventor of the Resp-O-Rator $^{\text{TM}}$ of which he holds two U.S. Patents.

SAVILLE SAWMILL KEEDYSVILLE, MARYLAND GARY NICKERSON

I want to alert MCW members to an opportunity to get green wood turning blanks at a reasonable cost.

On Saturday, May 22nd, my wife Barbara and I drove to Keedysville, to the **Saville Sawmill** and filled my Camry's trunk with green black walnut and cherry blanks, plus a gallon of green wood sealer. I spent a \$35 for the wood and \$15 for the sealer.

The sawmill owner is **Steve Saville**. He manages the forest on his property and also have logs hauled in. They have black walnut, oak, cherry, poplar and probably more. They some spalted logs, but do not have "figured" woods, which grow farther north. Steve says the best time to get wood is in the winter rather than the summer, but he did have plenty available the day we were there.

Steve and his helpers showed me what he had, cut the logs I chose down the middle, and helped me load them in the car. The scenery is also very nice there. I could not have asked for a better experience for gathering some turning blanks.

The address for the mill is 5222 Mt.Briar Road, Keedysville, MD 21756. E-mail – sawmill52221@aol.com. Home phone is 301/432-2302 and Cell phone is 301/491-0543. I recommend you call to make an appointment. We went on Saturday which seemed a good time, since Steve had more time for us. It is also good idea to use Map Quest or Google Maps to get directions (below). We had a little trouble finding the place, but, we called Steve and he talked us into his place.

Keedysville is in the panhandle, close to the Antietam Battlefield, between Boonesboro and Sharpsburg. Take I-270N to Frederick. At Frederick, take Exit 32 to merge on to I-70W. Take Exit 52 to US-15S/US-340W. About 15 miles, turn right onto MD-67N [Rohrersville Road]. After about 6 miles, bear left onto Trego Road, that then becomes Mt.Briar Road. Follow for about $1^1/2$ miles to #5222, on the left.
