

JUNE PROGRAM – CLIF POODRY TECHNIQUES & TOOLS FOR TURNING A "SOUTHWEST" OPEN FORM

AT our June 9th meeting, our ever-popular and ever-talented Vice President, Professor Clif Poodry, will set a new world record with his 6th appearance as an MCW demonstrator. When the Guinness record people were contacted, they showed little (i.e., no) interest... but what do they know.

Clif holds down a demanding, full-time job at the National Institutes of Health and he teaches turning classes at the Woodworkers Club virtually every weekend. Despite all the demands on his time, Clif manages to squeeze out enough time to turn and carve a vast array of small and large hunks of wood into elegant pieces of art and practical, useful items.

[Furthermore, he has managed to raise a young fellow named Colin who can use a skew chisel as well or better than people 3/4-times his age and experience.]

This time around, Clif will show us how to turn an **Open Form** – a cross between a bowl and a hollow form... picture a bowl with the top turned in, or a hollow form with a big opening. This is sometimes called a "Southwest" form.

Clif will begin with comments on wood selection, grain orientation, and design – all of which are very important for achieving a pleasing shape in the finished piece.



One of the most important aspects of Clif's demonstration is that he will use only hand tools – no lasers and nothing constrained. The tools he will use include a variety of gouges, Ellsworth hollowers, and a hooded ring tool. He will demonstrate the techniques for using these tools efficiently and safely, especially in the difficult interior shoulder area, often working blindly.





MAY MEETING MINUTES

BERT BLECKWENN called the meeting to order with 35 MCW members present. Joining her husband Brent, **Kathy** made the Clayton's a family membership.

Bert announced the availability of the AAW Symposium Raffle tickets at the meeting for a chance to win the Powermatic 3520B Lathe decorated by Binh Pho. Tickets are \$10 each. An additional five MCW/AAW Raffle tickets will be drawn at the June meeting. The AAW Raffle will be held at the June AAW Symposium and the winner does not need to be present to win. Free shipping is included.

A drawing was held for the MCW Turning Give-Back Program with **Bert Bleckwenn** the winner of the vessel turned by **Eliot Feldman**. Bert will turn a piece for the June Turning Give-Back.

Jack Enders was the raffle winner for the Banksia Pod vessel turned by Allen Alexopulos at our previous meeting.

The May 13th Skills Enhancement session was canceled due to a lack of a minimum of two participants. The May 22nd session had three participants.

Our application for a \$1,000 AAW Grant has been approved. We will match the grant amount with MCW funds to expand our MCW Skill Enhancement Facilities. We will be merging some of the Warrior-In-Transition Support Program equipment and optimizing usage between both programs. Volunteers were requested to support the Skill Enhancement Program and work with Bert to select equipment. No one stepped forward, so Bert will work directly with Matt Nauman, manager of the Woodworkers Club, to determine how best to use the funds.

The Warriors-In-Transition Support Program is now operating at the Walter Reed Art Therapy Department at the old Walter Reed Hospital site. The support program is

continuing through July with **Don Van Ryk** leading the effort. Sometime in July, the program will likely be suspended as the Art Department is temporarily relocated to mobile trailers at the Bethesda Hospital site. The Art Therapy Department anticipates moving into their new permanent facilities in Bethesda in the November timeframe, but with less space than they currently have available. Don will assess MCW options for continuing our support once the Art Therapy Department is in their permanent quarters in December.

The **Silent Auction** had a good mix of wood blanks. Of special interest were several pieces of rare American Chestnut that Phil Brown obtained and made available to the club.



Clif Poodry led the Show & Tell session with a variety of turned objects. Eliot Feldman brought a broken Spalted Maple piece he plans to use in applying some of Margaret Lospinuso's techniques of deconstruction/reconstruction. Members are increasingly bringing in occasional failures or less than successful pieces as learning lessons for everyone.

Mark Verna operated the video equipment for filming the demonstration, but continuing difficulties with the hodge-podge of old equipment is making it difficult to produce a high quality recording. Upgrades to our recording capabilities are clearly needed.

Gary Guenther introduced Margaret Lospinuso, our featured demonstrator and she provided an enlightening perspective on deconstruction/reconstruction techniques.

SKILL ENHANCEMENT FACILITIES

In an initial planning meeting with Matt Nauman of the Woodworkers Club, we discussed alternatives for supporting skill enhancements and turning class offering improvements. Since the Woodworkers Club staff will be attending major tool vendor events in June and July, we have decided to wait for information on lathe and equipment discounts before determining actual purchase plans for expanding the Skills Enhancement facilities.

Rather than just buying additional Jet Midi-lathes, we are considering other brands for midi-lathes such as the highly rated Delta and General models, if special pricing discounts are available. We also thought it would be valuable to have a variety of lathes present in the classroom that are sold by the Club and that MCW members and students have access to for evaluating purchase alternatives.

Funding for these expansion plans will be the recently approved AAW \$1,000 grant and a matching amount from the MCW treasury.

SPECIAL SILENT AUCTION

As a result of a recent visit to one of our library exhibits, a part-time resident and woodturner in Montgomery County by the name of Malcolm Bale contacted me about disposing of a significant portion of his remaining turning stock for health reasons. He is primarily interested in finding a good home for his stock with fellow turners and secondarily recouping some minimal costs. After reviewing his turning stock, I agreed that MCW would be willing to pick up the turning stock at his home and place it in our *Silent Auction*.

We agreed that proceeds would go to Malcolm with MCW retaining 20% for providing transport, processing and a single source for disposing of all of his stock. The initial set of turning stock consists of Walnut, Cherry, and Maple along with some single pieces of Magnolia, Orange Osage, Sycamore, and Goncalo Alves. The remaining stock is large Maple sections. Most of the stock was cut 10-12 years ago and air-dried in his home and is of good quality. There are a few cracks, and checks as usual, but all have been anchor-sealed and of good quality.

I've picked up about half of the turning stock and will be placing it on a separate table for our Silent Auction over the next couple of months. I plan to pick up the remaining stock in the coming days as well for placement in future Silent Auctions. I will retain any items that do not sell for use in our Skills Enhancement Program and/or our upcoming Fair demonstrations.

I encourage members to take advantage of this excellent selection of fine blanks.









Don was one of my mentors at CAW before he went into "retirement" down in Virginia at Smith Mountain Lake, where he now has a new 1200 square-foot shop populated with 4 lathes and a 22,500 square-foot garden! Hardly a day goes by that he doesn't get some turning in. This guy can do it all. This is going to be a very special evening – don't miss it
