This meeting will have the normal Business Meeting, Silent Auction, and Show & Tell.

The Program for this meeting will consist of three components:

- 1) We will have a session of Member-supplied "Jigs 'n' Tips";
- 2) we will have a session for Member-supplied Safety Tips; and
- 3) we will socialize a bit with a *potluck dinner* and perhaps get to know a little more about each other away from the lathe.

Please plan to leave a copy with me, and I'll get them all combined and written up for distribution into one document after the meeting.
- 3) Since there's not enough support for a stand-alone Picnic, we're going to do the next best thing, and have a potluck at our meeting. MCW will provide plates, cups, tableware, and napkins, as well as drinks (bottled water and sodas). YOU are asked to kindly provide the foods: appetizers, salads, hot dishes, desserts, and the like -- not too many desserts!Let's try to keep it relatively healthy. Exhibiting At The 2013 County Fair (Phil Brown)

Bert Bleckwenn planned, gathered, and orchestrated setup of lathes, tools, and wood for the MCW turned wood demonstrations at the Montgomery County Fair (page 11&12), and at least 12 additional members demonstrated, many of them on two different days. There were lots of turned pieces on our show and touch table. Inside the Arts, Crafts and Photography building were just four turned pieces, plus two flat-work models with turned elements. Only three of these were by MCW members. There we are outdoors demonstrating wood turning, while we don't have a nice showing of juried work inside.

For 2013, I hope to change that picture with much more juried and award winning turned work on display. My challenge to MCW members living in Montgomery County is to turn a new and wonderful piece for the Fair, legibly sign it, and bring it to the July or August 2013 MCW meeting. I will enter it into the Fair in your name and pick it up from the Fair. There is no entry fee, and I have your address and phone from the membership file.

Only one piece may be entered in a class (you can't compete against yourself), but there are several classes in which turned work could be entered by children, teenagers, and adults. In Division 3: CRAFTS, under CREATIVE AND HOLIDAY CRAFTS are class numbers:

- 326 Christmas tree ornaments, other
- 327 Christmas decoration (other than wreaths, tree ornaments, ceramic or porcelain items) may include candles
- 329 Holiday decoration (any occasion other than Christmas) may include candles
- 330 Mobiles, puppets and marionettes, any material
- 335 Handmade toys and games, any material (other than dolls and stuffed animals)

Under WOOD CFAFT are class numbers:

- 368 Hollow ware/flat ware, plates, bowls, etc.,
- 369 Spindle turned items,
- 374 Wood carvings other than birds,
- 375 Novelty wood craft.

In Division 4: Educational and Recreational Hobbies, are class numbers:

- 390 Collection of 15 or more items made by the exhibitor (mounted securely such as in a shallow box or as an object like the 25th anniversary piece MCW members made for AAW),
- 399 working or scale model, and
- 400 a model such as a car or other vehicle.


Thanks to the MCW Fair Volunteers

Expanded Times

Because of vehicle restrictions during the fair, we set up on Friday prior to the fair opening and closed down on the following Sunday which actually ended up working well. We expanded our demonstrations ton include the first Saturday and also demonstrated for the full day on the last Saturday as well. The weekend days actually had much high traffic volumes and thus ended up being great demonstration times as well.





We contributed again this year to help decorate the Old Timers Christmas tree with snowmen, icicles and tops. In addition, in honor of the 50th anniversary of the Old Timers participation in the fair, we were asked to turn the ornament for the top of the tree which was a collaboration between Bert Bleckwenn turning the ornament and Margaret Follas chip-carving the 50th anniversary numbers into the accompanying top ring.





Blacksmith Raffle Contributions

We collaborated with the blacksmiths again this year by turning candlestick stands, napkin ring holders, flower stands for holding some of the blacksmith creations and a honey bowl for their wrought iron honey dipper stand.

Demonstration Layout

• We were located in the same area this year under two giant oak trees across from the blacksmith area and the Old Timers General Store. The location works great for fair traffic. We had a much easier time

this year with canvas side flaps added to the tent so we could easily setup and closedown each day. We also added two mobile safety shield to help protect the public and make it easier to turn larger items.

• The Woodworkers Club really helped out tremendously by using their truck to transport the lathes and other items to and from the fair this year. They also provided one of their Nova DVR lathes so we had a larger lathe available for demonstrating as well.



- We improved public safety by adding two mobile safety shields in front of each lathe with attached 2'x3' MCW banners.
- Bob Browning set up his Spring Pole Lathe and gave his legs a good workout throughout the fair.

Margaret Follas augmented the Woodworking demonstrations with her chip carving techniques.

Other Points Of Interest

We also were able to turn a couple of small projects including a raptor perch stand, dome cover for an antique coffee grinder and replacement chair spindles for other fair demonstrators. Since we are not able to sell items, we asked for donations to be made to the Old Timers Area for supporting maintenance and enhancements to the area.

Even with signs out that we do not sell items on display, there was a lot of interest in purchasing items of knowing where there could purchase items. For future demonstrations, it would be nice if we had a list of members that would be interested in either turning custom items or willing to sell items. If this is something of interest to members, perhaps we could create a section on our MCW website identifying members that will sell work and/or do custom work. Let the officers know if this is something that would interest you. With the Woodworkers Club's plans for a display gallery in their new facility, this might be another reference we could use as well.

Thoughts for Next Year

- With a lot of requests for selling, it would be nice to have a list of MCW members that would be willing to be referred for requests for turned objects or custom work
- The Old Tiers General Store does have to sell items made and donated by MCW, so would suggest developing a list of suggested items that we could turn and donate during the week of fair demonstrations.
- There is a lot of kid traffic, so we might consider preparing top blanks before hand to speed up turning tops that can be given away to the kids. We might also consider creating an MCW activity of turning tops prior to the fair that could be given away as well. Perhaps a contest as to who could turn the most tops prior to the fair.

The SawStop demo by the Woodworkers Club was an attention grabber. We need to think of something that we could demo that would draw more of a crowd such as load, noisy and/or startling. We can make use of the fair's PA system to announce any special activity or regularly scheduled activities.

Please note: There will be two Demonstrations in October, the first a stand-alone, and the second with a normal meeting, as follows:

• October 11, 2012 – Ernie Conover – topic TBD

This will be a demonstration only, not a full meeting. There will be NO business meeting or Show & Tell. This is the date when we would normally meet. The regular meeting this month will, however, be held the next week.

Ernie Conover is a well-known author in the woodworking field with ten books, many videos, and hundreds of articles to his credit. His work has received numerous awards and been the subject of several one-man shows. Ernie is a long-time contributor to Fine Woodworking, a furniture maker, and a tool aficionado. While he is best known for teaching and writing about woodturning, he is also called upon as a machine designer, having designed and marketed the Conover lathe. Ernie and his wife, Susan, run Conover Workshops, a craft school where he teaches woodworking and woodturning courses, and she teaches fiber arts classes. www.conoverworkshops.com There will be a \$10 demo fee.

• October 18, 2012 - Liam O'Neill - topic TBD

Note that this meeting is one week after our normal meeting date, to accommodate Liam's travel schedule. This will be our normal, complete meeting for the month.

Liam O'Neill is one of the true legends in woodturning. He will be visiting from his workshop in County Galway, Ireland. Liam is the "Irish" in the "Irish Grind" for bowl gouges, which design variation he introduced to people like David Ellsworth in 1982. In 1983, he was a founder of the Irish Woodturners Guild, the world's first national woodturning organization. In that time frame, he won several national First Prizes for his woodturnings and also a scholarship to travel to the U.S.A. to study advanced woodturning with leading American Woodturners such as Bob Stocksdale and David Ellsworth. While here in 1986, he played a part in the formation of the AAW.

Liam has been a production turner and also an educator, having taught at Arrowmont for ten years. He makes everything on a lathe from traditional pieces to massive outdoor sculptures. The development of woodturning techniques has always been important to him. He is a master craftsman and wood artist with a unique understanding of his medium. It is said that the quality of his bowls lies in their subtle detailing as well as the intrinsic beauty of the wood. Even so, his interests have always lain in the way in which he could use woodturning creatively to make unique sculptural pieces. For the latter, which are found in

many international collections, Liam has specially designed and built a large, outdoor lathe with a concrete headstock sporting a 2.5" spindle, a nearly 6-foot swing, a 12-hp motor, an integrally mounted chainsaw, and a gantry for lifting logs into place!

Interest in Liam's work has grown enormously in recent years, fuelled by high-profile commissions and the fact that examples of his work have been presented to leading world figures as gifts from the Irish Government.
