

Jeff Salter has been creating beautiful, hand-turned wooden pieces in his studio in Ann Arbor, MI since 1993. A woodworker since childhood, inspired by the natural grain patterns of each piece of wood, Jeff



now turns artistic pieces for galleries and private collectors. He also turns customized, one-of-a-kind, solid-shell drums for himself and for other percussionists. I'll let you figure out how he makes those incredible one-piece, endgrain drums from logs! He plays them in three bands. I found his

website to be a rich and excellent representation of his extensive repertoire of bowls, boxes, urns, vessels, and wall hangings.

<u>http://www.jeffsturnedwood.com</u> Jeff clearly has a great eye for design -- look in his Gallery to see his vessels and finials and burls and natural-edge work and see if you don't agree.

In addition to being a passionate woodturner, Jeff is also an educator and tool designer. He shares his knowledge with the woodturning community through oneon-one lessons, on-line teaching, and club demonstrations. He has done vendor booth demonstrations with Stubby-USA at several national AAW woodturning Symposia. His professional work as an Optical Engineer



informed the development of the "Easy-Tracker", a new type hollowing guidance system employing a "Radial Centric" laser head to bring higher accuracy and ease of alignment to deep-hollowing operations.


I was so impressed with his work that I asked him if he would demo for MCW, and he agreed to fit us into his already-busy September schedule. He'll begin by talking about design while showing some of his forms as examples and then go to demonstrating live how to make one of his signature "Morel" forms -- in this case, a vessel -- including the turning and texturing and burning. The turning will be very technical and instructive for a variety of projects, with the inside grooved halfway through with a special tool. This opens up lots of possibilities for multiple design ideas. Then Jeff does his style of texturing, halfway through from the outside to meet the inside grooves. Let there be light! A little open flame completes the job of heightening the contrast of the edges. The result is very intriguing.

It will be a great evening. Plan to join us from the comfort of your own home, and join other members in showing some of your own work in our Show Tell & Ask session before the Program! Please don't forget the \$10 Demo Donation.

Montgomery County Woodturners Meeting Minutes August 12, 2021

The Montgomery County Woodturners August 2021 meeting was called to order at 6:58 pm with 15 people present. Due to technical problems with President Bob Anderson's computer, the meeting began with Mike Corella presiding over the Show, Tell and Ask portion of the meeting. Members presenting were Chuck Engstrom, Gary Guenther, Joe Barnard, John Laffan, Paul Paulkstelis, Tim Aley, Alan Wertzel and Mike Corella.

Next, President Anderson took over the meeting, welcoming those present. There were no new members or guests. The club is always **looking for new members** and encourages members to invite people they know who are turners or interested in turning to come to a meeting and join us.

Anyone who did not pay their **2021 dues** by mid-April or contact Steve Drake regarding financial hardship, was dropped from the membership roll and added to a "Friends" list and will only receive the monthly newsletter.

President Anderson thanked Sue and Mike Corella for hosting MCW's annual **Picnic and Ice Cream Social** held July 25 at their home. He reported it was great seeing many members for the first time in over a year and those present enjoyed the tour of Mike's shop.

MCW's Audio/Video Committee (Joe Stout, Mike Corella, Joe Barnard, Tim Aley and Bob Anderson) recently visited the remodeled space at Woodcraft to see the new Classroom 3 and to get training on the use of the new equipment. MCW will have to purchase some new equipment to be able to show live demonstrations both in the classroom and as IRDs for folks watching from home. While there, the cabinet in the former meeting room was emptied and the A/V equipment was removed. A box containing a camera and microphone locked in the cabinet was missing.

The **next anticipated in-person meeting** is scheduled for December 21, 2021. In light of the delta variant, we will continue to assess the state of the covid pandemic so that can we follow the best scientific information available. Individuals attending MCW meetings will have to be fully vaccinated.

A survey of MCW members was undertaken by club officers in late July. President Anderson reported that most wanted to return to live meetings but were concerned about Covid. Only one thought the pandemic was overblown. Many liked the convenience of the Zoom meeting from both the standpoint of not having to drive to the Woodworkers Club (WWC) and greater visibility of the demonstration via multiple cameras. Some members were concerned about returning to an enclosed indoor space while others missed the camaraderie of in-person get togethers. At least three other clubs in the area are also doing member surveys.

The **Montgomery County Agricultural Fair** is on. It will run from August 13-21. Tim Aley is in charge. See the *Turning Journal* for more information.

Octoberfest will be held Oct.2 at the WWC. MCW will do demos and members are welcome to apply for booths to sell their own goods. Mallory will be getting the application form soon and

asks that members take good images of their work so they can be ready once the form is available. Present at the event will be food trucks and the True Respite Brewing Company (the sponsor) truck. More information will be made available as it comes in.

Gary Guenther will be stepping down as **Program Chair** after the January 2022 meeting. He is responsible to securing demonstrators for our meetings. Please consider stepping up to this critical position or running for any of the other MCW officer positions.

We still need a chapter representation for Women in Turning (WIT). Contact President Anderson if interested.

If you plan to attend an event to **sell your work**, please let Mike Colella know so the information can be included in the monthly *Turning Journal* and interested members can spread the word and get out and support your efforts.

MCW and other woodturning clubs in the area are interested in developing a group of turners with excellent skills who can get out and **demonstrate their skill**. Please let us know if you would like to be considered.

During the Covid Pandemic, all in-person programs and events remain on hold. They will resume once the pandemic ends.

Roman Steichen is offering an all-day **acrylic pan turning class** called Pen 2. For more information, see <u>the announcement</u> on the Woodworkers Club site.

Matt Radtke is developing two new classes as well. One is an entry level **resin platter class** and the other is a Bowl from a Board class, which will require the Beginning Bowl Turning class as a prerequisite. More information of this will be coming soon.

Please continue to support our friends at the Woodworkers Club.

This evening's demonstrator was Art Liestman who will demonstrate a Lost-wood Box. You can see more of his work on his website at http://www.artliestman.com/

Our next meeting will be Tuesday, September 21 at 7 pm via Zoom.

MCW 2021 FUTURE REMOTE PROGRAMS (Gary Guenther)

October 7, 2021 (Zoom 7:00 p.m.) - Robin Costelle - Finial and spindle gouge

As promised, I'm having Robin Costelle back again, after an excellent program for us in April. Robin is an amateur, hobbyist woodturner, just like us. He has been woodturning since 2003 and has run the gamut from pens and bowls and boxes to large, complex segmented forms and sculptures. I've long been a fan of his elegant finials and bark-edge pedestal boxes. Design and form and line are very important to him, and his forms are always impeccable. I have asked him to turn one of his special finials for a HF that includes a mini version of the HF itself in the design.

Robin turns, teaches, and demonstrates in and around his home state of Kentucky, but now he's branching out (yes, that's a tree joke) with several IRDs. Besides woodturning, he also dabbles in pottery and building wooden musical instruments, outfitting fly rods, and crafting wood fishing nets. You

www.robincostelle.com/ Robin lives on a small farm outside the town of Fern Creek, near Louisville, in north-central Kentucky along with his wife, Connie, and three children.

Robin is a finial master. His finials are made specially to go with his hollow forms. The finials often contain a diminutive representation of the vessel itself. Is that cool, or what? Here are a couple examples of what I'm talking about. (Yes, those subtly beaded hollow forms in the photo were made in two pieces, just like the one he did for us.) Now we're

going to get a finial to go with it. He's going to show us the techniques, tricks, and tips for using a spindle gouge effectively and efficiently while making a spectacular finial in the process.

Saturday, Nov. 6, 2021 (Zoom 1:00 p.m.) Philip Greenwood – Bark-edge Pot

Philip Greenwood (is that a great name for a turner?) is a delight. Perhaps you watched his excellent demo of an earring stand for Chestnut/Conkers back in March. I was extremely impressed by his teaching skills and the tool use he displayed during this demo of an everyday object, and I sought him out. Phil graciously accepted my invitation to turn for MCW. Tentatively, I have asked him to demonstrate a bark-edge pot for us.

Phil lives in the North Yorkshire area of England, only about ten miles from Castle Howard, where *Brideshead Revisited* was filmed. He started woodturning full time in 1986 and attended craft fairs for more than 12 years. He was accepted onto the Register of Professional Turners in 2006, showing he had reached a very high



standard. He has been a woodturning demonstrator since 2008 at clubs and exhibitions. He has published over 60 articles in *Woodturning* Magazine. He likes to work with native timber, sourced locally. His work ranges from utility ware to works of art. He produces small to large items, which he sells at the shop adjacent to his workshop. Phil has a great attitude, to go with his skills, and this is guaranteed to be a fun and instructive demo.



Remote Connections (Gary Guenther)

One positive that has come in response to the loss of in-person camaraderie caused by the pandemic is the proliferation of new venues of free online woodturning content. A number of woodturners feeling the lack of customary togetherness are creating and participating in online venues to try to keep the community connected via interactive demonstrations, interviews, and discussion sessions. In two cases these are being assisted by corporate sponsorship. Here are five excellent examples for your selection.

Conkers Live

This is a regularly-scheduled series of free, interactive woodturning demonstrations, sponsored by Chestnut Products (which produces a variety of finishes, dyes, etc.). There is no overt advertising. The purpose is to support demonstrators and keep turners together during the lockdown. All the demonstrations are free to watch and can be accessed from this web link: https://chestnutproducts.co.uk/conkers-live/ It is based out of the UK and hosted by Terry Smart. It is distributed directly from their website and requires no Zoom or registration -- just tune in as you would with YouTube. Each show is a different demonstrator. They are produced in the evening UK time, which is early afternoon EST. You can subscribe to their bulletins to get updates about events and demonstrators. Future dates are Dec.14, Jan.11, Feb.4, Feb.24, March19, April12, and May 12.

Woodturning Live

This regularly-scheduled series of free, interactive woodturning demonstrations, held via the Zoom platform, is sponsored by Record Power, a respected equipment maker. There is no advertising. It is hosted by Mike Davies from New Zealand with Aussie turner Theo Haralampou as the demonstrator. They are transmitted in the morning from NZ/Oz, which puts them in early evening EST. I find Theo's demonstrations to be interesting, informative, varied, and excellent. To join these educational and entertaining live sessions simply email miked@recordpower.co.uk with RSVP in the subject line, and you will immediately receive your log-in code by return email.

Meet the Woodturner

This regularly-scheduled series of live interviews is based in UK and hosted by Pat Carroll from Ireland. Each episode highlights the woodturning life of a well-known turner in an interactive Q&A session with questions also taken from viewers. To sign up for these Zoom sessions, email meetthewoodturner@gmail.com and you will receive invitations.

Behind the Scenes

This "occasional" show is periodically sponsored by Trent Bosch Studios and also highlights the woodturning life of a famous turner in each episode. https://virtualwoodturningdemos.com/ These are on Zoom, and free, but registration (for \$0.00) is required. These freebies are held in conjunction with other paid IRDs sponsored by Trent. You can get on a mailing list to receive the announcements of future programs.

Talking Turning

This is a regularly-scheduled series of shows sponsored by the Association of Woodturners of Great Britain (AWGB) -- their version of the AAW. The focus here is a live Zoom forum for talking about various preselected turning subjects and having Q&A during the sessions, with an hour of open-mike discussion with attendees participating. Register in advance to ensure you receive the email with meeting details. The meetings are at 2:30pm EST every Tuesday and Friday afternoon.
