Emiliano is located near the town of Makawao, in the heart of Upcountry Maui, Hawaii. He creates artistic pieces from native Hawaiian woods including Koa wood, Koa, Milo, Kamani and others. He makes Koa calabashes (our previous demo by Emiliano was a calabash with pewa repairs); salad bowls; lidded, handchased threaded boxes; hollow forms; urns; and custom pieces. Emiliano uses primarily windfall Hawaiian woods. He says that he signs his pieces "KEA," with the "K" being for his wife Katie, who is his biggest supporter and critic. As

President's Perspective - Bob Anderson

It sure would be nice to write a newsletter article about something other than Covid, and it's assumed that we'll get there. However, while the omicron variant seems to be in some decline (as this is written), it is still with us and there is a new omicron subvariant - nuts.

One upcoming issue is that of attendance at the AAW Symposium this summer. We all want to get back to normal, and many want to plan to go to this premier woodturning event but may remain hesitant due to the pandemic. Part of folks' decision will probably be made in conjunction with how Tennessee is faring.

A recent email from a member of MCW included a picture of attendees at the recent Tennessee Association of Woodturners Symposium, with around 60% of the participants in a session unmasked, sitting close together. As of January 22 (when this is written, a long time ago in this pandemic), cases had risen 16% over the previous week and 153% since the beginning of January. Current Tennessee statistics are here. This is not meant to discourage anyone, but to be one point of reference as folks plan ahead.

The AAW Symposium website states:

Covid-19 Statement

AAW leadership recognizes that Covid-19 status in the U.S. and internationally changes weekly and that we cannot predict the future of this virus, especially more than six months from now. In late spring 2022, we will revisit information about the state of Covid-19 in the world, the U.S., and Chattanooga, TN, and determine Covid-19 protocols for the 2022 inperson symposium. These protocols may include masking, social distancing or required vaccinations, and will incorporate registered attendees, demonstrators, vendors, volunteers, staff, and the general public invited to participate in the trade show and view the galleries. AAW will provide refunds to attendees and other symposium stakeholders for a period of time if the protocols influence decisions to attend.

An email to AAW Executive Directer Phil MacDonald yielded a similar direction; in essence, we don't know where things are going but will take every measure to ensure the health and safety of all participants and may refund symposium registration fees "for a period of time." This is an honest stance; there really isn't much we've been able to predict and certainly no way to do so going forward.

So, this is all to offer information to members. We all have various tolerance levels to different situations, but at a minimum it's important to know the health and safety precautions refund policy if Covid remains an issue. For additional information moving forward, continue to monitor the AAW Symposium website. Bob

Montgomery County Woodturners Meeting Minutes January 6, 2021

The January Zoom meeting of the Montgomery County Woodturners (MCW) was called to order by President Bob Anderson on January 6, 2022, at 7pm with 22 present. There were no new members or guests.

Present Anderson reminded members that **dues should be paid soon**. The price of membership has increased this year to \$35 per individual and \$45 per family. Tim Aley, MCW's treasurer, can be paid directly or on the website using PayPal or a credit card.

Anderson encouraged club members, aware of people in the community who are turners or might be curious about the art, to invite them to attend one of our meetings. MCW is always interested in new members and new talent.

Anderson told members that our **regular Thursday night meeting slot is again available** at Woodcraft for future gatherings. That is the Thursday before the second Saturday of each month. Eight months have been scheduled for in person meetings. Check the *Turning Journal* for more information. Our next in person meeting is scheduled for March 10 provided the Covid pandemic is under control.

Anderson then **thanked Mike Colella** for his excellent work in preparing the club's monthly *Turning Journal*. Last months was particularly challenging given the huge number of photos of pieces from the in-person December meeting, which was essentially an extended Show, Tell and Ask session.

Mike Collela asked members to check the names and phone numbers in the volunteer section of the Turning Journal for accuracy.

The **next in-person meeting is scheduled for March 10**Anderson reminded members that if they plan to **sell or display** their work, they should let Mike Colella know so that he can include the information in the *Turning Journal*. They should also let Joe Barnard know so that such information can be included in the library displays.

Joe Barnard has in his possession works from 5-6 members that were returned from **library exhibits**. The labels from these exhibits faded, so if you are missing pieces that were part of those exhibits, please check with him to get them returned. Joe also

asked that if members have pieces they would like to be part of future library exhibits, to let him know directly.

MCW Member Loaned Work for Public Library Exhibits, 2022 We will receive your year-long loan of turned wood pieces at both the December 2021 meeting and the January 2022 meeting, for month-long wall case exhibits at Montgomery County Public Libraries in 2021. Approximately 50 pieces of all sizes are needed, and particularly pieces fitting on a 7 inch wide shelf. This includes candle sticks, tree ornaments, wands, tool handles, bottle stoppers, balls, boxes, platters, bowls, hollow form vessels, and sculpture, including easel-mounted platters or bowls. Do not include display stands since we have stands. Your phone number, but not prices, will be displayed. Any sale is directly between you and the interested buyer with delivery after the display is over. Pieces will be available for pickup at the MCW meeting in December 2022, or earlier by request. If you will be displaying in an exhibition or at a craft show, please let Joe Barnard at joseph.barnard@wood-crafted.com know prior to the start of the month before, and I will try to put a card in the case with that information when I set up the display. If you have questions, contact Joe Barnard at 301-943-1807 or joseph.barnard@wood-crafted.com This information form is needed with your pieces in order to prepare a label, insurance, and phone lists. Please bring your pieces in a box, or well wrapped for stacking if in a bag, with your name on the container. If you don't name your pieces, be warned, Joe Barnard will do so.





Invitation to AAW WIT Virtual Event on March 5, 2022: Artist Woodturner Tania Radda demonstrates live

On Saturday, March 5, 2022, at 4:00 p.m. Eastern Time, artist sculptor Tania Radda will present during an interactive demonstration via the AAW WIT free virtual event. She will be sharing lots of ideas and techniques for new turners or experienced turners. It will be fun, and we hope you will attend!

Tania Radda's artist interest started at early age while growing up in Brazil. She was mostly intrigued by the whimsical aspects of flora and fauna. Today, Ms. Radda holds a master's degree of Fine Arts in sculpture with a specialization of sculpture media in wood. Her lifelike sculptures are inspired by nature, insects, plants, and animals. In an interview, she said, "I enjoy nature, and making

reference to the process of growth. I use curls and spirals in my work to invite the viewer to see lines that help the eyes look beyond the static presentation of the piece. It is important to me to interpret what I see in a whimsy manner, as I believe it invites the viewer to participate and appreciate the piece."

Ms. Radda is a professor of Wood Programs at Arizona State University where she inspires young minds about wood sculpture, how to apply elements of art to woodturning, texture, colors, and wood carving to mention a few. She is committed to sharing her knowledge and inspiring others, especially women to become expert wood turners.

Remote Connections (Gary Guenther)

One positive that has come in response to the loss of in-person camaraderie caused by the pandemic is the proliferation of new venues of free online woodturning content. A number of woodturners feeling the lack of customary togetherness are creating and participating in online venues to try to keep the community connected via interactive demonstrations, interviews, and discussion sessions. In two cases these are being assisted by corporate sponsorship. Here are five excellent examples for your selection.

Conkers Live

This is a regularly-scheduled series of free, interactive woodturning demonstrations, sponsored by Chestnut Products (which produces a variety of finishes, dyes, etc.). There is no overt advertising. The purpose is to support demonstrators and keep turners together during the lockdown. All the demonstrations are free to watch and can be accessed from this web link: <u>https://</u>

<u>chestnutproducts.co.uk/conkers-live/</u> It is based out of the UK and hosted by Terry Smart. It is distributed directly from their website and requires no Zoom or registration -- just tune in as you would with YouTube. Each show is a different demonstrator. They are produced in the evening UK time, which is early afternoon EST. You can subscribe to their bulletins to get updates about events and demonstrators. Future dates are Dec.14, Jan.11, Feb.4, Feb.24, March19, April12, and May 12.

Woodturning Live

This regularly-scheduled series of free, interactive woodturning demonstrations, held via the Zoom platform, is sponsored by Record Power, a respected equipment maker. There is no advertising. It is hosted by Mike Davies from New Zealand with Aussie turner Theo Haralampou as the demonstrator. They are transmitted in the morning from NZ/Oz, which puts them in early evening EST. I find Theo's demonstrations to be interesting, informative, varied, and excellent. To join these educational and entertaining live sessions simply email miked@recordpower.co.uk with RSVP in the subject line, and you will immediately receive your log-in code by return email.

Meet the Woodturner

This regularly-scheduled series of live interviews is based in UK and hosted by Pat Carroll from Ireland. Each episode highlights the woodturning life of a well-known turner in an interactive Q&A session with questions also taken from viewers. To sign up for these Zoom sessions, email meetthewoodturner@gmail.com and you will receive invitations.

Behind the Scenes

This "occasional" show is periodically sponsored by Trent Bosch Studios and also highlights the woodturning life of a famous turner in each episode. <u>https://virtualwoodturningdemos.com/</u> These are on Zoom, and free, but registration (for \$0.00) is required. These freebies are held in conjunction with other paid IRDs sponsored by Trent. You can get on a mailing list to receive the announcements of future programs.

Talking Turning

This is a regularly-scheduled series of shows sponsored by the Association of Woodturners of Great Britain (AWGB) -- their version of the AAW. The focus here is a live Zoom forum for talking about various preselected turning subjects and having Q&A during the sessions, with an hour of open-mike discussion with attendees participating. Register in advance to ensure you receive the email with meeting details. The meetings are at 2:30pm EST every Tuesday and Friday afternoon.
