Additionally, MCW is always interested in expanding its membership, and so members knowing people in the community interested in woodturning but who are not members should consider inviting them to a meeting to learn more about the art.

Mid-Maryland Woodturning Club is organizing a **three-club show** at the Delaplane Arts Center in Frederick, Maryland for February 2023. In addition to Mid-Maryland and MCW, Chesapeake Woodturners is also participating. Tim Aley is coordinating the event for MCW. Each club is invited to submit 15 pieces. MCW will be collecting entries from its members by late November. The aim is to limit "not for sale" (NFS) pieces and use the opportunity for sales. Members wishing to participate in the event must decide by Thanksgiving.

"When a Tree Falls" Building on the success of the "Tree Spirits" exhibition in the fall of 2020, we would like to propose a new exhibition in the fall of 2023, preferably October of that year. This proposed exhibition would be called "When a Tree Falls." It would be a juried exhibit of the best-turned vessels, boxes, and other wooden objects created by members of three area woodturning clubs displayed on pedestals and/or tables; an exhibit of paintings, drawings, photographs, quilts containing images of trees, leaves, and seed pods; and could include wood sculpture displayed on walls of the Delaplaine. Like the Tree Spirits exhibition, the three-participating wood turning clubs, all chapters of the national level American Association of Woodturners, http://www.woodturner.org/, are: 1. Mid-Maryland Woodturners Club, (MMWTC) meeting in Frederick, MD. www.mmwtc.org/ 2. Montgomery County Woodturners, (MCW), meeting in Rockville, MD.

www.montgomerycountywoodturners.org 3. Chesapeake Woodturners, (CW), meeting in Annapolis, MD. www.chesapeakewoodturners.com Jurying of member submitted pieces would be done at or near the current club meeting locations, with each club given a quota of twenty wood turnings each for a total of sixty pieces for the exhibition. Each club would designate at least two individuals familiar with wood turned art, including professional turners, collectors, wood artists or others as appropriate to jury their club's submitted pieces to select which twenty turnings would be accepted for their club to be entered into the exhibition. A minimum of forty white pedestals can be supplied by the three participating clubs in addition to any pedestals the Delaplaine Arts Center may wish to provide. Additionally, 6- or 8-foot-long tables with white tablecloths, raised approximately 8 inches off the floor, could be utilized to display pieces. We do not have any special installation needs for our exhibition. Various examples of our club members' work can be seen on our websites listed above. To comply with entry instructions, we have also submitted 10 digital images of selected representative club member turned items for your review. We have also included two photos of our 2020 Tree Spirits Exhibition at the Delaplaine so that you may recall the scope of what we are proposing. To contribute to the financial wellbeing of the Delaplaine Arts Center, we propose the exhibition run at least a month's time in 2023. That most, if not all, juried pieces be for sale with the Delaplaine receiving up to a 30% commission on all sales. All sold pieces to remain on site until the end of the exhibition. Juried pieces can run into the thousands of dollars, but most pieces will be in the several hundred-dollarrange. The large room floor space of the West Gallery of the Delaplaine Arts Center is well suited for positioning a substantial array of pedestals and/or tables in a well-lit space. Additionally, the Delaplaine's location being relatively near rural areas and landscape settings with trees, is well suited for displaying the beauty of wood and trees. To carry a wood and tree theme throughout the exhibit, it is recommended that an exhibit of approximately forty two-dimensional artwork pieces incorporating trees or tree elements be hung on the walls. Such hanging artwork can be arranged by the clubs

with the help of experienced local artisans, such as Kesra Hoffman, as done for the Tree Spirits exhibition. COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT PROGRAMMING & OUTREACH The Frederick Community continues to grow its interest in wood-turned art. The Mid-Maryland Woodturners Club, a non-profit 501(c)3 corporation, has grown from just eight members in 2011 when it met in the downstairs woodshop of the Delaplaine, to approximately 100 members today! Its mission, as well as the other two clubs, is to educate its members and the public on the art and craft of woodturning. The Frederick Community has been extremely receptive to our public demonstrations during the Frederick Festival of Arts, Schifferstadt Oktoberfest, the Maryland Iron Festival, etc. We have built a fan base that continues to grow, and we see this exhibition opportunity at the Delaplaine as a win-win for all involved. To further engage and educate the community, a wood turning demonstration on one or two portable lathes could be conducted in a selected area outside of a gallery (or designated space) during the opening reception or on another appropriate occasion. Additionally, a lecture or talk about the kinds of woods or trees represented in the exhibition could be arranged. Resume As chartered clubs of the national level American Association of Woodturners, the three clubs identified in our proposal have a committed association with each other to bring handcrafted turned wood art to the attention of the public. We have and will continue to take "public education," as stated in our mission statements, seriously. We have coordinated together on several successful exhibitions at the BlackRock Center of the Arts in Germantown, MD; the Popcorn Gallery at Glenn Echo Park in Glen Echo, MD; and at the Delaplaine Arts Center.

Please mark these important dates on/in your calendars!

We will start collecting submissions for this show starting after Thanksgiving. We get 15 items in the show and if we get 15 people entering pieces, we will choose an item from each. We will determine a fair method of filling the show if more or less people enter items. Our goal is to get as many people in the show as possible so please consider entering a piece or two. Get ready to make some pieces!!

Installation may begin at 10:00 am on Tuesday, Jan 31, 2023, and must be completed by noon on Thursday, Feb 2, 2023.

All artwork and pieces, sold and unsold, must remain in the exhibit until 4:30 pm on Sunday, Feb 26, 2023.

All unsold work must be removed between 4:30 - 5:00 pm on Sunday, Feb 26, 2023, or on Monday between 9:00 am to 4:30 pm.








Remote Connections (Gary Guenther)

One positive that has come in response to the loss of in-person camaraderie caused by the pandemic is the proliferation of new venues of free online woodturning content. A number of woodturners feeling the lack of customary togetherness are creating and participating in online venues to try to keep the community connected via interactive demonstrations, interviews, and discussion sessions. In two cases these are being assisted by corporate sponsorship. Here are five excellent examples for your selection.

Conkers Live

This is a regularly-scheduled series of free, interactive woodturning demonstrations, sponsored by Chestnut Products (which produces a variety of finishes, dyes, etc.). There is no overt advertising. The purpose is to support demonstrators and keep turners together during the lockdown. All the demonstrations are free to watch and can be accessed from this web link: https://chestnutproducts.co.uk/conkers-live/ It is based out of the UK and hosted by Terry Smart. It is distributed directly from their website and requires no Zoom or registration -- just tune in as you would with YouTube. Each show is a different demonstrator. They are produced in the evening UK time, which is early afternoon EST. You can subscribe to their bulletins to get updates about events and demonstrators. Future dates are Dec.14, Jan.11, Feb.4, Feb.24, March19, April12, and May 12.

Woodturning Live

This regularly-scheduled series of free, interactive woodturning demonstrations, held via the Zoom platform, is sponsored by Record Power, a respected equipment maker. There is no advertising. It is hosted by Mike Davies from New Zealand with Aussie turner Theo Haralampou as the demonstrator. They are transmitted in the morning from NZ/Oz, which puts them in early evening EST. I find Theo's demonstrations to be interesting, informative, varied, and excellent. To join these educational and entertaining live sessions simply email miked@recordpower.co.uk with RSVP in the subject line, and you will immediately receive your log-in code by return email.

Meet the Woodturner

This regularly-scheduled series of live interviews is based in UK and hosted by Pat Carroll from Ireland. Each episode highlights the woodturning life of a well-known turner in an interactive Q&A session with questions also taken from viewers. To sign up for these Zoom sessions, email meetthewoodturner@gmail.com and you will receive invitations.

Behind the Scenes

This "occasional" show is periodically sponsored by Trent Bosch Studios and also highlights the woodturning life of a famous turner in each episode. https://virtualwoodturningdemos.com/ These are on Zoom, and free, but registration (for \$0.00) is required. These freebies are held in conjunction with other paid IRDs sponsored by Trent. You can get on a mailing list to receive the announcements of future programs.

Talking Turning

This is a regularly-scheduled series of shows sponsored by the Association of Woodturners of Great Britain (AWGB) -- their version of the AAW. The focus here is a live Zoom forum for talking about various preselected turning subjects and having Q&A during the sessions, with an hour of open-mike discussion with attendees participating. You can go here for more info: https://www.awgb.co.uk/talking-turning-zoom-sessions/ After registering, you will receive a confirmation email containing information about joining the meeting. Register in advance to ensure you receive the email with meeting details. The meetings are at 2:30pm EST every Tuesday and Friday afternoon.
